


Code of Conduct for parents of county age group players

Norfolk Cricket Board

All parents of Norfolk Cricket Board County Age Group Players will:

- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person within the context of Cricket.
- Treat everyone equally and not discriminate on the grounds of age, gender, disability, race, ethnic origin, nationality, colour, parental or marital status, religious belief, class or social background, sexual preference or political belief.
- Not condone, or allow to go unchallenged, any form of discrimination if witnessed.
- Display high standards of behaviour.
- Promote the positive aspects of Cricket, the Norfolk Cricket Board and the 'Spirit of Cricket' at all times.
- Encourage all participants to learn the Laws and rules and play within them, respecting the decisions of match officials.
- Actively discourage unfair play, rule violations and arguing with match officials.
- Recognise good performance not just match results.
- Place the well-being and safety of children above the development of performance.
- Respect and defer to the decisions and expertise of County Managers and County Coaches.
- Not offer coaching or tactical advice from the boundary during play.
- Parents should not enter the dressing room during the match.
- Parents should not enter the field of play while the match is in progress.
- Respect children's opinions when making decisions about their participation in Cricket.

The top-right quadrant is red with a white cricket ball. The bottom-left quadrant is yellow with a white cricket ball. The bottom-right quadrant is grey with a white cricket ball. A white diagonal band with a row of seven white stars runs from the top-left to the bottom-right.
- Not provide children with alcohol when they are under the care of the Norfolk Cricket Board.
 - Abide by the ECB / NCB codes on use of Social Media relating to CAG Cricket at all times.
 - Follow ECB guidelines set out in the “Safe Hands – Cricket’s Policy for Safeguarding Children’ and any other relevant guidelines issued.
 - Report any concerns in relation to a child, following reporting procedures laid down by the ECB.
